<p><u>Chalk Painting Letters</u></p> <p>Ask Mom or Dad to write your name outside with chalk, then using the link above create your own paint and trace the letters you see.</p> 	<p>Have a Puppet Show!</p> <p>Make puppets out of paper bags decorated with markers, paper, and glue, or out of socks decorated with buttons, yarn, and thread. Put on a puppet show for your family!</p>	<p>Alphabet Match</p> <p>Have your mom or dad help you cut out pictures from a magazine and use the letters of the alphabet to match the beginning sounds of the objects in the pictures.</p>	<p>Roleplay</p> <p>Gather all of your zoo animals stuffed animals and pretend to be a zookeeper. Set up a zoo in your bedroom and take care of each animal. Head to the zoo with Elmo and see how each animal lives at the zoo!</p>
<p>Storytime: Goodnight Gorilla</p> <p>Listen to the story below called, 'Goodnight Gorilla' and practice writing the first sounds you hear for each animal the zookeeper says goodnight to. Example: G for Gorilla Story Here</p>	<p>Handwriting Practice</p> <p>Practice your handwriting skills by choosing one of the tracing activities here. For even more practice try doing them all!</p> 	<p><u>Alphabet Penguin Plunge</u></p> <p>Waddle like a penguin to fetch different letters of the alphabet! Note: you don't need a kiddie pool as the link says- feel free to get creative and make your own penguin pool!</p>	<p>Sound Lesson "m"</p> <p>You'll need: glue, paper, beans, and a pencil. Mom/Dad will write the letter "m" and say the sound that this letter makes to the child. Help your child identify objects in your house that start with the sound 'm', like mirror, mom, monkey, mango, magnet. Put glue on top of the letter, have the child glue the beans all around the "m". Write down one of the objects that you found next to the sound "m".</p>

This primary colors card will help your child with the identification and recognition of the colors. I can smell flowers, brownies, popcorn, and soap.</p>	<p>Rhyming Words</p> <p>Click on the bats' bellies to hear the words, and then match the words with rhyming sounds Click Here.</p>	<p>I Spy Game</p> <p>Create your own I spy tray. Collect 6 toys and put it on a tray. Ask a family member to play with you the game. Describe the toys like this. "I-spy an animal." "I spy something yellow." "I spy a letter". Take turns with each other :)</p>
<p>Favorite Song</p> <p>Sing your favorite Circle Song and make a video of it. Send it to your teacher :)</p>	<p>Scrapbook</p> <p>Make a scrapbook of some of your favorite or familiar things by cutting out pictures.</p>	<p>House Game</p> <p>Exchange roles in the family, pretending to be the child. Talk about the different rooms and furnishings in the house</p>	<p>Object Activity</p> <p>Place familiar objects in a container. Have your child remove the object and tell you what it is called and how to use it. "This is my ball. I bounce it. I play with it."</p>
