<p>Sight Words Stack</p> <p>Write 20 sight words on small dixie cups. Read the word and start to stack your cups. <p>Going on a Letter Hunt</p> <p>Make a letter chart from the whole alphabet. Write uppercase and lowercase letters together. Now find a magazine or newspaper and find those letters and glue them on your chart. Happy hunting!</p>	<p>Letter</p> <p>Write or draw a letter to your teacher telling him/her about what you have been doing at home.</p>	<p>Rhyming Words</p> <p>Click on the bat's bellies to hear the words, and then match the words with rhyming sounds Click Here.</p>	<p>Ball Game</p> <p>Tape a bunch of letters to a wall. Call out the sounds and throw the ball at the letter represented. As an added bonus, kids get to work on their coordination as well as their alphabet recognition.</p>
